## ADVISORY COMMITTEES TO THE BOARD

The Board shall utilize advisory committees to counsel it, as one means of determining the needs and desires of the school district and its residents. The central purpose of all advisory committees is to contribute to the educational program by conducting studies, identifying problems by conducting studies, identifying problems, and developing recommendations that will enhance the effectiveness of the decision making process. The ultimate authority to make decisions shall continue to reside in the Board.

Specific topics for study or well-defined areas of activity shall be assigned in writing to each committee. Upon completing its assignment, each committee either shall be given new problems or shall be dissolved promptly but shall not be allowed to continue for prolonged periods without a definite assignment. Each committee shall be instructed as tot eh length of the time each member is being asked to serve, the service the Board wishes to render, the resources the Board intends to provide, the approximate dates on which the Board wishes to submit reports and the approximate date on which the Board wishes to dissolve the committee.

The Board has the sole power to dissolve any of it is advisory committees.

The Board shall inform the public of the services rendered by these committees and their conclusions and recommendations.

Advisory committees are subject to the Right to Know Law.
