SCHOOL CLOSINGS

No school, office, or system event cancellation, remote instruction days, or delay will be made without the direct authorization of the Superintendent of Schools. In the event the Superintendent is unavailable, such decisions will be made by the Building level Principals.

Announcements: When the Superintendent decides it is necessary to delay opening, remote instruction, or close any facility or school or cancel any school event, he/she will initiate all related communications to the public by radio, television, website, or other available means.

Remote Weather Instruction Days (RWID): The Superintendent would determine if RWID can be called the days before the impending weather before students have left for the day or shortly after. The RWID plan would involve students continuing in their planned lessons remotely and with minimal disruption to the instructional flow. The general practice is that all teachers will post assignments by 8am and will be available to students from 8am-2pm.

<u>Delayed Opening of Schools</u>: The Superintendent may delay the opening of schools upon determining that weather conditions appear extremely hazardous to operate school buses at the regular early morning hours, but that travel conditions will appreciably improve later in the morning. The public announcement will report the delayed opening, including the cancellation of morning Pre School. Schools and offices shall close on the regular schedules. After-school activities and events may not be affected by a delayed opening.

Closing of Schools Only for the Entire Day: When the Superintendent determines that weather or other conditions exist or will develop that would make it unwise to open one or more schools any time during the day, the announcement communicated through television station, and district phone alert system shall state that the school district is closed. If school is closed for the entire day, all evening programs will be cancelled. Exception to evening program may be made by the Superintendent after consultation with the Director of Transportation and specific criteria and conditions being met.

Afternoon and Evening Program Cancellations: When schools are open to the end of the school day but weather or other conditions deteriorate in the late afternoon, the Superintendent may decide to cancel afternoon and evening programs. Schools and offices should plan and communicate alternate dates and times to hold programs or events.

<u>Weekend Closings</u>: When weather or other conditions are predicted or develop that would make it hazardous to operate weekend programs or events, the Superintendent is responsible for decisions regarding cancellations and for notifying the appropriate media.

Students, parents and staff shall be informed early in each school year of the procedures which will be used to notify them in case of emergency closings, whether action is taken before or during school hours.
